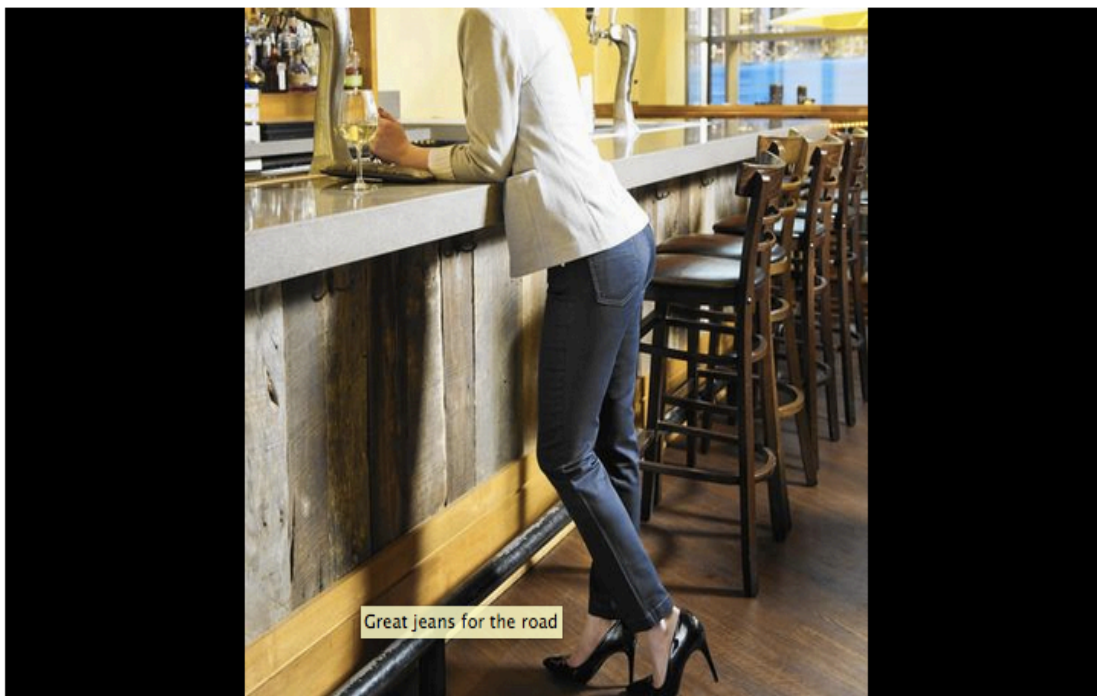




Jeans keep a woman traveler looking sharp on the road

Name: Beija-Flor Audrey Ankle jeans

What they are: stylish Brazilian-designed lightweight jeans that flatter a woman's curves no matter how trying the road becomes. These midrise jeans are made with a soft denim blend of cotton, polyester and elastane. Company co-founder Emilie Whitaker wrote me that the blend of fibers allows the jeans "to offer unparalleled elasticity and super-soft flexibility. The denim is a key part, but the construction of the jeans ensures a lasting fit as well." The jeans looks good on a variety of figures due to strategically placed stitching and pockets engineered for a woman. Available in black, navy and terra cotta. Sizes range from 0 to 16.

The good: Before I flew in Beija-Flor jeans, I usually boarded planes in comfy but unattractive sweats. These jeans help me look good without sacrificing any comfort. And they are more breathable than sweats, so I perspire less. I have flown and slept in comfort wearing the jeans on 10- to 12-hour flights. I have slept so well that I think Beija-Flor should create some jean pajamas. Plus, the jeans retain their shape and don't wrinkle even on long, cramped flights in economy.

The bad: I had to go up a size for more room due to the slim-cut thighs. I would like to see a version with roomier thighs.
